Conference Policies:

The following policies and expectations are in place to ensure every delegate has an enriching experience at ClintonMUN.

Attire: Delegates are required to adhere to formal Western business attire for the duration of ClintonMUN. Exceptions may be made in crisis committees for character-specific costumes, but prior approval from the committee chair is necessary.

Expectations in Committee: Delegates are expected to uphold decorum, respect, and professionalism during all committee sessions. While representing your assigned country's stance, please communicate your points respectfully. Please follow the expectation below in order to help us create an inclusive and engaging environment for all delegates:

- Only one delegate may speak at a time during moderated caucuses. To speak, raise your placard and wait for recognition by the chair.
- Outside of Model UN Personal attacks will not be tolerated. In cases where such behavior occurs you may be asked to leave the committee/conference.
- Please Maintain focus and respect when others are speaking
- Do not speak without proper recognition and limit talking over others
- Please limit any and all unauthorized use of cell phones
- Do not use technology or any forms of AI when not permitted
- there is no toleration of any form of harassment, whether verbal, physical and will result in removal from the committee/conference.

Technology: Crisis committees operate under a strict no-technology policy—laptops and cell phones are not permitted during sessions. General Assembly (GA) committees allow limited use of technology strictly for resolution drafting during unmoderated caucuses and approved breaks. Laptops must remain closed during moderated caucuses and while fellow delegates are delivering speeches.

Mastering Crisis Committees

A *crisis note* is a private communication used in Model United Nations crisis committees, where delegates write notes to the crisis committee backrooms outlining their desired actions, plans, or requests within the simulated crisis scenario, allowing them to influence the narrative without directly stating their intentions in the main committee room; essentially, it's a way to secretly strategize and take covert actions within the committee.

A *press release* is a short, official statement that a committee uses to share important information with the public or other committees during a conference. It's written in a formal but simple way and is meant to inform people about major decisions, events, or updates happening in the committee. Since they're public, delegates need to be careful about what they say. Writing a clear and strong press release is a great way to try and control the committee's actions.

A *crisis directive* is a quick and simple way for delegates in crisis committees to take action during fast-paced situations. Unlike regular resolutions that take a lot of time and debate, crisis directives let delegates respond to urgent events right away. These directives are usually short and to the point, focusing on specific actions like sending in troops, creating alliances, or handling emergencies. Delegates can work alone or with others to write them, and once the committee approves the directive, the effects are immediately added to the crisis. This makes the committee more intense and exciting, pushing delegates to think fast, be creative, and adapt to constant changes.

A round robin is a quick way for each delegate in a committee to speak one after another without interruptions. If this motion is passed, then every delegate will have the chance to speak and participate, usually going in a circle until everyone has done so. It's usually used to gather everyone's opinions, brainstorm ideas, or plan the next steps during a crisis. Round robins help keep the discussion organized and make sure every delegate gets a chance to share their thoughts.

A crisis update is a news-style report given by the crisis staff to inform the committee about new events or changes in the scenario. These updates can include breaking news, conflicts, or unexpected twists that delegates must react to. They keep the crisis dynamic and push the committee to adapt their strategies.

Overview of the Committee



Across the galaxy, the Clone War is raging as the Galactic Republic and the Separatists battle for control of planets and star systems. The current year is 21 BBY (the Star Wars Universe uses a different time system-this moment is 21 years Before the Battle of Yavin), and the Galactic Republic is preparing to invade the planet of Geonosis for a second time to free it from Separatist control. The Separatists are mounting a formidable defense of the planet, which houses a major droid factory that produces a large portion of their army. Both sides are grappling with the unavoidable casualties that will come from this battle, and the cost of the war as a whole. The Republic, in particular, is struggling with a lack of morale, financial constrictions, and the ethics of producing clones for the sole purpose of throwing them into conflict. The Republic needs leadership and a clear path forward, but will the Galactic Senate provide it?

Note: While there are a plethora of online sources devoted to this topic, we may suggest watching the actual movie if possible (Star Wars: Episode II-Attack of the Clones).

Topic Background

The Star Wars galaxy is held together by an energy known simply as the force. The force has both a light and a dark side. The former represents peace and selflessness, and is embodied by the Jedi Order, while the latter, which represents anger and selfishness, is embodied by the Sith. Members of the Jedi and the Sith are able to harness the force to perform incredible feats such as lifting objects with their mind. The two orders are mutual enemies, though the Jedi have been able to maintain power throughout the time of the Republic. The Sith, however, seek a resurgence through the chaos that is the Clone War.

The Galactic Republic was founded in around 25,000 BBY to create a prosperous and secure galaxy. Created with democratic ideals, the Republic is governed by the Galactic Senate, which is composed of representatives from various planets, solar systems, and corporations. Currently, there are around 2,000 senators in the Senate, which is led by a Supreme Chancellor. In 22 BBY, the Republic was fractured by the rise of a Separatist movement that threatened the unity of its members. Led by Count Dooku, the Separatist movement, also known as the Confederacy of Independent Systems, seeks independence from the wider republic and is backed by a plethora of star systems and corporations. One notable corporation that backed the Separatist cause was the Trade Federation, led

by Nute Gunray. However, Gunray had one condition for joining the Confederacy of Independent Systems: the assassination of Senator Amidala of Naboo. A bounty hunter, Jango Fett, was commissioned to hunt down and kill the esteemed senator, but the first attempt on her life failed. Obi-Wan Kenobi and Anakin Skywalker were subsequently placed as her protection detail. After another failed assassination attempt, Kenobi was able to realize a connection between the bounty hunter and the planet of Kamino.

Once he reached Kamino, Kenobi was shown the clone army for the first time. He was the first person within the Republic to witness the creation of millions of soldiers, though it remained a mystery who had ordered the creation of those soldiers. The army got its name because all of the soldiers were identical clones of the bounty hunter Jango Fett. On Kamino, Kenobi also encountered Jango Fett, who was able to escape to the planet of Geonosis. Once he reached Geonosis, Kenobi learned of massive droid factories that were creating robotic battle droids to support the Separatist cause. Kenobi was then captured by Separatist forces, though he was able to alert his fellow Jedi of the coming threat. Jedi Anakin Skywalker and Senator Amidala were the first to arrive at Geonosis to attempt a rescue, but they were also captured. Kenobi, Skywalker, and Amidala were then sentenced to death by the Geonosian people.

As the events on Geonosis unfolded, the rest of the Republic was scrambling to respond. Chancellor Palpatine was granted emergency powers by the Republic Senate to pass the Military Creation Act while the Jedi marshalled the clone troopers. A large force of Jedi then made it to Geonosis to rescue the three hostages, but were quickly surrounded by battle droids. Intense fighting ensued, officially starting the First Battle of Geonosis and

the Clone War. The droid army initially surrounded the beleaguered Jedi forces, but clone reinforcements began to arrive and bolster the Republic numbers. The First Battle of Geonosis would end in a decisive Republic victory that led to the destruction of the droid factories on Geonosis. However, war would begin to spread and threaten even more planets as both Republic and Separatist forces began offensives throughout the galaxy.

The Current Situation

The Clone War has been raging for the past year and there is no end in sight. Both the Republic and the Confederacy of Independent Systems are grappling with the complexities of war and the rising number of casualties. Each side hopes to land a decisive, war-altering victory, but with so many fronts across the galaxy, each side is being pushed to the brink. The Republic is seeking its decisive victory where the war began-Geonosis. Despite the Republic capturing the planet to start the war, its people have been unexpectedly loyal to the Separatist cause. More droid factories have been established on the planet's surface, making it a critical target for Republic forces. A large force is being assembled to retake the planet, but a large number of casualties seems inevitable. The Republic finds itself in a precarious position as it determines how to best continue its invasion of Geonosis and its offensives around the galaxy.

While the Republic's armies question their tactics, the Republic Senate grapples with whether more clones should be produced. Senator Halle Burtoni has proposed the Republic Military Enhancement Bill, and it is under intense scrutiny. It calls for the

production of five million more clone troopers paid for through a loan with an extreme 25% interest rate. The Republic is already in debt from the war effort, and many senators are beginning to worry about the Republic defaulting on its debt. However, proponents of the bill are arguing that reinforcements are needed to truly have a chance at winning the conflict. Additionally, they argue that deregulating the banks can allow them to take out money in a safer manner. The first question that the Republic Senate must answer is how they intend to end the war, be it through the passage of the bill and increased military spending or through more diplomatic means.

The final major issue at the current moment is the role of the Jedi in the conflict. Many Jedi themselves are questioning whether they are betraying their duties as peacekeepers by acting as military generals. They are torn between their desire to protect innocents and their duty to the Republic. Many military leaders, such as Admiral Tarkin, are also questioning the Jedi leadership because they see them as ineffective. Determining how necessary the Jedi are to the war effort and if the Jedi even want to continue to participate is crucial to the continuation of the Republic offensives. Without the Jedi, the Clone Army will likely prove ineffective against the droid forces, meaning the Jedi may be more important to the fight than many realize.

Delegate Positions



Chancellor Palpatine

The head of the Galactic Senate and the Galactic Republic. He started out his political career as the Senator of Naboo, but was able to ascend to the role of Chancellor after Senator Amidala called for a no-confidence vote on his predecessor, Chancellor Valorum. During the Clone Wars, Chancellor Palpatine leads the Republic while also secretly working with the Separatists leader, Count Dooku. Not truly dedicated to either side in the conflict, Chancellor Palpatine only wants to see himself left standing at the end of the war. Chancellor Palpatine leads the Galactic Senate and is able to issue executive orders. Due to the conflict, the Chancellor has been given emergency powers that expand his legislative ability and influence.



Senator Padmé Amidala of Naboo

The esteemed Senator from Naboo is highly respected as a political figure. She was previously the Queen of Naboo, and is loved by her people. She is secretly married to Jedi Anakin Skywalker, and gets pregnant during the course of the Clone Wars. Senator Amidala does not support the continued production of clone troopers to fight in the war. She believes that this action would only proliferate the conflict, and seeks to use diplomatic measures to end the fighting. Senator Amidala holds considerable sway in the Galactic Senate, and is able to propose and vote on measures. Additionally, she is a member of the Loyalist Committee, a group which directly advises the Chancellor.



Representative Jar Jar Binks of Naboo

Jar Jar Binks is a great friend to Senator Amidala and is known for his extreme loyalty. Binks moved to grant Chancellor Palpatine emergency executive powers, which led to the creation of the Clone Army and the start of the Clone Wars. Similar to Senator Amidala, Binks seeks a peaceful resolution to the Clone War through diplomacy. Jar Jar Binks is well versed in diplomatic negotiations, and, despite only being a representative and not a senator, is able to propose motions on behalf of the delegation of Naboo.



Senator Bail Organa of Alderaan

Organa is a strong pro-democracy advocate who believes in sustaining the fractured Republic. He sees Chancellor Palpatine's increasing power as a threat to the institution that he holds so dear. Senator Organa also aims to limit the corruption that is taking root within the Republic. He is close with Senators Amidala and Mothma, as well as the Jedi Order. He has also done extensive work to benefit humanitarian causes during the war, including working with refugees. He broadly supports the war, but he hopes to limit collateral damage. Like Senator Amidala, Senator Organa holds a seat on the Loyalist Committee that advises the Chancellor, giving him considerable sway.



Admiral Wullf Yularen

One of the most well-respected naval officers within the Grand Army of the Republic, Yularen serves alongside Jedi General Anakin Skywalker during the Clone Wars. The youngest man to ever rise to the rank of Fleet Admiral, Yularen is a by-the-book officer who possesses near-unparalleled knowledge of military strategy and the bureaucratic Republic system. Yularen's pragmatism occasionally puts him at odds with other members of the Republic, but he is not cruel, he only seeks to find victory as efficiently as possible.



Anakin Skywalker of the Jedi Order

Known as the Chosen One, the Force-user set to bring balance to the light and dark sides of the Force, Skywalker is one of the strongest Force-users in the Jedi Order. During the Clone Wars, Skywalker leads the clones of the 501st Legion. He is secretly married to Senator Amidala. Anakin Skywalker is also loyal to Chancellor Palpatine, who he sees as a mentor. Unlike many in the Republic, Skywalker favors military force as a means to end the Clone War, and is not quite as fond of diplomacy. Skywalker is one of the more accomplished Jedi generals, and thus has plenty of influence within the Jedi Order and the ranks of the Army of the Republic.



Senator Orn Free Taa of Ryloth

Orn Free Taa represents the planet of Ryloth in the Galactic Senate. He is known as being friendly, but also extremely corrupt. He lives a life of luxury on Coruscant while his people are left to fend for themselves on Ryloth. He attempts to stay close to Chancellor Palpatine in an effort to keep his power. While many of his people are against further military spending, Taa supports measures to create more clones so he aligns with Palpatine. Taa is not only on the Loyalist Committee that advises Chancellor Palpatine, but also the Senate Appropriations Committee, giving him influence over spending.



Senator Mon Mothma of Chandrila

Mon Mothma represents the planet of Chandrila in the Galactic Senate. She opposes the war and seeks a democratic solution to end the fighting. She tries to engage in peace talks with the Separatists that ultimately fail. Mothma also opposes further military funding, especially to create more clone troopers. Mothma is particularly afraid of executive overreach, and worries that the emergency powers afforded to the Chancellor have given him too much power. Mon Mothma works closely with Senators Organa and Amidala in her efforts to protect the Republic.



Senator Halle Burtoni of Kamino

Halle Burtoni represents the planet of Kamino in the Galactic Senate. Kamino is most well known for being the planet where clones are produced. Burtoni strongly supports the war effort and military funding, which are crucial to her planet's power and economy. Burtoni's support of the military-industrial complex puts her squarely at odds with some of the more diplomacy-minded senators such as Senators Amidala, Organa, and Mothma. Senator Burtoni sits on the Defence Finance Committee within the Galactic Senate, where she is able to advocate for increased military spending.



Senator Aang of Roona

Aang represents the planet of Roona in the Galactic Senate. Aang holds immense power in the senate due to his vote on the Military Oversight Committee. While Aang has voted to prevent the further production of clone troopers, he is not as sure in his stance as other politicians. Senator Aang is seen as a more moderate member of the Galactic Senate who is not committed to a particular path to peace. Senator Aang's planet is known for being along an important trade route, so protecting Roona's economy is of the utmost importance to the senator.



Senator Riyo Chuchi of Pantora

Riyo Chuchi is a newer, more timid member of the Galactic Senate. She is known for being an idealist who is not driven by personal gain. She generally joins forces with the more progressive figures of the Senate, including Senators Mothma, Organa, and Amidala. Senator Chuchi seeks to end the war through diplomacy and without the further production of clones. She is particularly interested in the issue of clone rights. She wants more people to recognize the clones as individuals worthy of respect and not just pawns in a larger conflict. She is not particularly influential or powerful compared to other senators, but her resolve and morals are never to be questioned.



Senator Rush Clovis of Scipio

Senator Clovis represents Scipio, home of the major banks in the galaxy, in the Galactic Senate. The banks themselves are neutral entities in the war. Clovis is closely tied to corporations and businesses such as the Trade Federation. His connections to said corporations mean that he often puts profit over people and the Republic. Senator Clovis's connections to the banks gives him plenty of influence in the financing of the clone army. He seeks to continue the production of clones to ensure that his planet's interests remain profitable.



Lott Dod of the Trade Federation

Lott Dod represents the Trade Federation in the Galactic Senate. As he yields to a business and not a planet, he has no constituents. He seeks to expand the war and play both sides to make as much money as possible. Dod is actually largely supportive of the Separatist cause, as his business makes handsome amounts off of war profiteering. He also supports the continued production of clone troopers to further draw out the conflict. Dod doesn't truly care about any moral cause in the war, just that it continues so that he can make more money. His business, the Trade Federation, is critical to much of the galaxy's commerce, making him a vital ally for the Republic, despite the fact that he does not care for it.



Senator Meena Tills of Mon Cala

Meena Tills, a Mon Calamari, represents the ocean world of Mon Cala. Her world faces increasing difficulties. Two species live on Mon Cala. The Mon Calamari support the Republic, while the Quarren support the Separatists. These tensions are coming to a head, and Tills seeks Republic support in restoring diplomacy on her planet. Despite her need for Republic intervention, she is critical of the military-industrial complex. Tills supports diplomacy as a means to end the war, and is known among her fellow senators as a skilled diplomat with a deep knowledge of the bureaucracy that is the Galactic Senate.



Gume Saam of the Techno Union

Gume Saam represents the Techno Union, a corporation, in the Galactic Senate. Similar to the other businesses, he seeks to further profits. Saam and the Techno Union secretly support the Separatist cause. Like Lott Dod of the Trade Federation, Saam's primary goal is to further enrich his business. He supports the Separatists and further military spending by the Galactic Republic to ensure that the conflict continues and he can turn a profit. Saam is close to Chancellor Palpatine so that he can maintain strong relations with the Republic. Aside from the war, he wants weaker Republic restrictions on commerce. Saam is known to have influence in the commercial sphere but not so much in the political realm.



Obi-Wan Kenobi of the Jedi Order

Obi-Wan Kenobi is a Jedi general in the Grand Army of the Republic. He is also a member of the Jedi High Council, the body that dictates the allegiances and policy of the Jedi Order. Kenobi believes in integrity and protecting civilians during wartime. Despite being a general in the conflict, he is often shown as a caring person who is able to put the needs of innocents above the need to win a battle. He sees himself as a peacekeeper fighting to protect the Republic, not a warmonger. He previously mentored Jedi Anakin Skywalker, and the two share a close connection during the war. Kenobi struggles to balance his need to protect people and planets with his role in the violence as a general.



Admiral Wilhuff Tarkin

Admiral Tarkin was a military leader within the Grand Army of the Republic who was especially favored by Chancellor Palpatine. Tarkin is a staunch supporter of military force as a means to end the conflict. He strongly disagrees with the involvement of Jedi in the conflict because he believes their code prevents them from being fully committed to achieving victory. Tarkin embodies a “the ends justify the means” style attitude and is a formidable enemy due to his wealth of military knowledge and connections to Chancellor Palpatine.



Mas Amedda

Mas Amedda was once the senator of Champala, but is now the Vice Chair to the Supreme Chancellor. Amedda is extremely loyal to Chancellor Palpatine and serves his every whim. Therefore, he is a proponent of increasing the production of clone troopers like the Chancellor, and seeks the continuation of the Clone War with a stronger military. Amedda cares about his political standing more than anything, which largely explains his closeness to the Chancellor. He is a master at utilizing the bureaucratic system to his advantage, and ultimately seeks greater power for himself through his endeavors.



Jedi Grand Master Yoda

Yoda is renowned for his talents with the force, and holds the highest position with the Jedi Order. He is wise and insightful, and holds unparalleled sway over his fellow Jedi and other members of the Republic. Yoda leads troops into combat for the Republic like many other Jedi, but he questions the Jedi's role in proliferating the conflict. Yoda's main motivations are to protect the Republic and the Jedi Order from the Separatist threat. He hopes to achieve peace through diplomacy, not war.



Captain Rex

Captain Rex is a clone trooper who leads the 501st Legion into battle under Jedi General Anakin Skywalker. He is seen as quick-witted and compassionate by those around him, and is extremely knowledgeable when it comes to military tactics and maneuvers. While he doesn't possess any political influence, he is respected by his fellow soldiers and Jedi. Like all clones, he is disrespected by most of the Republic as he is seen as a soldier but not an individual. Rex has a complicated perspective on the continued production of clones. On one hand, he wouldn't be alive if it weren't for the war and the creation of the clone army. On the other hand, he recognizes that he and his fellow clones are often seen as pawns in a much larger game.

Questions to Consider

1. How will the upcoming Battle of Geonosis be approached? Will an effort be made to minimize casualties, or is the objective so crucial that it must be taken at all costs?
2. Should more clones be produced, or should more diplomatic means to end the war be pursued? Is the Republic financially secure?
3. Are the Jedi blinded by their sense of duty to the Republic? Should they be military leaders, and are they even effective in these roles?
